WHY/HOW: Charlie Rauh is the second artist to serve in LSU Vet Med's residency program

and the first musical artist in this role across the United States. Throughout his residency, Rauh composed and recorded at least six original songs, many inspired by observing the trust between veterinarians and their animal patients. During this program, he had the opportunity to explore how art can heal these animals and promote teaching in this niche field. The concert will highlight this unique collaboration between music and veterinary medicine and is free and

open to the public.
